Meeting Description:

The New Year ushered in a new administration with a revised focus on the safety and health of the American worker. Under the direction of David Michaels Assistant Secretary, OSHA has a renewed focus on enforcement and standards setting. The February ASSE Safety Roundtable meeting will be an overview of the yearly OSHA performance in Region One including a fatal accident review and a breakdown of what can be expected from OSHA in 2010.

A strong emphasis on enforcement is expected in 2010 with an increased budget and more than 130 new Compliance Officers being recruited and many of them will be bilingual and/or health specialist. The refocus on enforcement emphasizes the need to continue building on the cooperative programs and the relationships that have been developed. This roundtable will review what emphasis areas the Compliance Safety and Health Officers (CSHO) will normally be focusing on during an inspection on your facility. In addition, some of the topics to be covered will include what documentation you can be expected to provide to the CHSO during an inspection. Recordkeeping, Silica, other health hazards, Residential Construction, Electrical Safety, Fall Hazards, Severe Violators Enforcement Program are all emphasis programs and reasons for OSHA to inspect your project and each one is a little bit different. The recently published Field Operations Manual (FOM) gives both the agency and its customers direction of what the inspection process will entail.
